2015-16 School Calendar

A DRAFT of the 2015-16 school calendar was reviewed by the Treynor Board of Education at the March school board meeting. Unfortunately, we are still waiting for the State Legislature to make a final decision pertaining to school start dates. Once this occurs, the official 2015-16 school calendar will be adopted.

Here are a few "highlights" within next year's calendar:

- Registration will be held Monday, August 3 in the HS Commons.
- School will begin one week later than previous school years.
- We will continue with a 3 day break at Thanksgiving.
- Due to the later start, second semester will not end until mid-January rather than prior to Christmas.
- Both semesters contain 90 days.
- Third quarter Parent/Teacher conferences align with Easter creating a nice 6 day Spring/Easter break for families.
- If weather cooperates, the school year will conclude on May 27.

Snow Day/Make-Up Day Plans.....

As we enter the final quarter of the school year, it's time to try and forecast the last day of school for this year. Thus far, we have missed four full days of school due to snow days and state tournament days. Fortunately, we have three days allocated in the current calendar that students will not have to make up. Therefore, students only have one day of school to make up, pending any additional weather issues. All make up days will be added to the end of the school calendar. At this time, school is scheduled to dismiss on May 26.

"District Details"...a few notes from Superintendent Elwood

Treynor Community Schools Property Tax Rate to Decrease by \$.39

The Treynor Community School's Board of Education reviewed the projected 2015-16 school budget at their March meeting. The levy rate paid during the 2014-15 school year is \$14.17. The new rate for 2015-16 is projected to decline to \$13.78. Therefore, the school's portion of your property taxes will be reduced by .41 cents.

This will be the fifth year in a row the school district has been able to reduce their property tax rate. The rate has fallen from \$15.93 to \$13.78.....a total decrease of \$2.15.

Mrs. Jill Kay Named as New Elementary Principal

Fourth quarter is here—don't let the school work slide!

The school year has gone by so quickly that it's hard to believe we are in the fourth quarter already. We recognize that this is the time of year when some students tend to start letting their work slide because they would rather be outside enjoying the weather than working on homework. "Parents Still Make a Difference" has a few suggestions for parents in regard to this. They are as follows:

- 1) Ask questions about assignments. Which one was the most interesting? Which one was the most difficult? What are you studying now in History? Do you have any projects or tests coming up? Convey to your child that you are still very much interested and want them to continue focusing on school work.
- 2) If your teen averaged three hours of homework per night during the winter, a new 15 minute homework average should make you suspicious. A comment like, "Your teacher sure let up on the homework suddenly", might be enough to fix the problem.
- 3) Suggest that your teen do the reading aspect of homework on the front steps. That way they are still able to enjoy the sun without sacrificing homework time.

Cardinal Financial Literacy Update

Financial Literacy Month



In 2005, the U.S. Senate passed (by an overwhelming vote of 48 to 2) a bill declaring April as Financial Literacy month.

President George W. Bush elevated the importance of financial literacy by signing an executive order establishing the President's Advisory Council on Financial Literacy. It's goal is to improve financial education efforts for youths in schools and for adults in the workplace. In 2010, President Obama furthered the cause by signing <u>Executive Order 13530</u> and created the President's Advisory Council on Financial Capability to assist the American people in understanding financial matters and making informed financial decisions.

While this groundswell of support for financial literacy in schools is certainly needed and welcome, it is important to remember that kids learn the most about money by watching the adults around them. There are a number of other resources available to help you understand the essential facts about money so you can pass along good money habits to your kids. Some of these include these resources available through the Federal Trade Commission (FTC):

- Money Matters offers short, practical tips, videos, and links to reliable sources on a variety of
 topics in English and Spanish, ranging from credit repair, debt collection, job hunting, and job
 scams to vehicle repossession, managing mortgage payments, and avoiding foreclosure rescue
 scams.
- <u>Free Annual Credit Reports</u> offers details about a consumer's right to a free copy of his or her
 credit report from each of the three national credit reporting agencies, upon request, once every
 12 months. Reviewing one's credit report regularly is an effective way to deter and detect identity
 theft.

To become knowledgeable about financial information, begin by understanding the industry terminology. Here are a few financial terms that appear regularly in business publications and financial documents.

- Dow Jones Industrial Average (the Dow) the oldest and most widely quoted stock market gauge. Consisting of a select group of 30 stocks, experts believe it represents the overall market at any moment in time.
- S&P 500 a stock market index containing the stocks of 500 Large-Cap corporations (corporations with a market capitalization of \$5 billion or more), most of which are from the United States
- Share of Stock represents a fraction of the total ownership of a corporation.
- P/E Ratio (price to earnings ratio) a measure of the price paid for a share relative to the annual income or profit earned by the firm per share.
- Dividends* earnings from corporate stock or credit union share accounts.
- Liquidity* the quality of an asset that permits it to be converted quickly into cash without loss of
 value. For example, a mutual fund is more liquid than real estate.
