## Treynor CSD Property Tax Rate to Decrease for 7th Consecutive Year ....

The Treynor Community School's Board of Education reviewed the projected 2017-18 school budget at their March meeting. This will be the seventh year in a row the school district has been able to reduce our property tax rate. The rate has fallen from $\$ 15.93$ to $\$ 13.34$...a total decrease of $\$ 2.59$.

The levy rate paid during the 2016-17 school year is \$13.44. The new rate for 2017-18 is projected to decline to $\$ 13.34$. Therefore, the school's portion of your property taxes will be reduced by .10 cents.


## 2016-17 School Calendar Adjustment ....

Please note: No school for students on April 26.
The school calendar was adjusted at the March school board meeting. April 26 was originally scheduled as a 1:00 p.m. dismissal day for staff professional development. We have contracted with the ALICE Training Institute to provide updated intruder response training for our staff and will need the full day to accomplish the training. Therefore, students will not attend classes on April 26 and will not need to make up this time.

## 2017-2018 School Calendar

The school calendar for 2017-18 was approved at the March school board meeting. A copy of the calendar can be viewed on the school website under the "calendar" tab. Here are a few "highlights" within next year's calendar:

- Registration will be held on Tuesday, August 1 in the HS commons.
- School will begin on Wednesday, August 23 w/ a 1:00 p.m. dismissal on the first day.
- No School on Wednesday, November 22, prior to Thanksgiving break.
- The first semester will end on January 12, but semester tests will be given prior to Christmas break [as was done this year].
- Graduation is scheduled for May 20.
- The projected last day of school is Thursday, May 31.
- For students and staff, three extra days are included in the calendar for snow days, unforeseen cancellations, state tournament days, etc. If we don't use all the built in days, school could dismiss prior to May 31.

Soon, students will be taking their annual spring tests. Starting on Monday, April 3, our middle school students will be taking the lowa Assessments. The students will test at the beginning of each day on Monday/Tuesday/Wednesday of that week. (Thursday and Friday will be make-up days.) The results have been used several ways including the following:
$\checkmark$ Helps the school determine any subject areas or concepts that may need more teaching emphasis.
$\sqrt{ }$ Scores for schools throughout lowa are posted on the Department of Education's website and families moving into the area compare school's test scores when deciding which school to enroll their children.
$\checkmark$ A student's individual scores help determine if he/she is making appropriate academic progress or may need additional academic support.
$\sqrt{ }$ Taking the tests prepares students to take other standardized tests, including college entrance exams such as the ACT.
$\checkmark$ Test results help determine if the school has met Annual Yearly Progress goals set by the state.

Please try to make sure that your child is getting plenty of rest and eating a nutritious breakfast before heading off to school each day so they are at their best for testing.

## LAKIN OUTSTANDING TEACHER AWARDS



Charles Lakin was a well-known area philanthropist who was a native of Emerson, Iowa. He created these awards in 2008 to recognize teachers who "motivate kids to come to school each day, " and see teaching as a calling, rather than a job. Over the last nine years, the Lakins have awarded more than $\$ 330,000$ to area teachers and their associated school districts.

This is the 10th Anniversary of the awards whose purpose is to reward and acknowledge teachers who, "entice students to come to school every day". This year there will be 4 awards of $\$ 10,000$ each-two for elementary school teachers and two for secondary school teachers. In addition, each recipient's school will receive \$2,500.

Eligible teachers must be certified full-time teachers or counselors currently employed in accredited lowa schools with a minimum of three years continuous teaching experience in the same school. -Symptoms include sudden onset of fever, headache and stiff neck Other symptoms include: nausea, vomiting, sensitivity to light and confusion
-The disease is spread through the exchange of respiratory and throat secretions
-Teenagers and young adults are at increased risk
