LAKIN OUTSTANDING TEACHER AWARDS



Charles Lakin was a well-known area philanthropist who was a native of Emerson, Iowa. He created these awards in 2008 to recognize teachers who "motivate kids to come to school each day, " and see teaching as a calling, rather than a job. Over the last ten years, the Lakins have awarded more than \$360,000 to area teachers and their associated school districts.

This is the 11th anniversary of the awards whose purpose is to reward and acknowledge teachers who, "entice students to come to school every day". This year there will be 4 awards of \$10,000 each—two for elementary school teachers and two for secondary school teachers. In addition, each recipient's school will receive \$2,500.

Eligible teachers must be certified full-time teachers or counselors currently employed in accredited lowa schools with a minimum of three years continuous teaching experience in the same school. SPANISH CLASSES IN TREYNOR

Apart from learning the language, getting to know the Spanish speaking countries' culture is another important target for Spanish classes. Moreover, I would like to tell you about two activities on which we have worked and on which we are working in Spanish 1 and Spanish 2 classes:

PALOTEAO

"Paloteao" means "dancing with sticks" (palo means stick). It is a typical dance in some regions in Spain. Some towns or valleys have their own choreography using sticks. I selected a very special one, my mom's town song. Senegüé is a tiny town on the skirts of the Pyrenees mountain range, next to the French border. Though it has only 100 inhabitants, this town owns its song. This love story was supposedly written by a heartbroken soldier 80 years ago. His beloved woman came from Senegüé.

We worked on the song in Spanish 1. The students could learn some vocabulary while singing and dancing to it. When I proposed they dance to it during the Pops concert last March 13, twenty-seven freshmen volunteered. They were great and had a lot of fun.



PEN PALS FROM SPAIN

I was able to contact two different schools from Pamplona, my hometown, to get pen pals for all 6th graders (73) and all Spanish 1 (65) and Spanish 2 (54) students. One hundred ninety-two students have a Spanish student contact. They are exchanging information about themselves and their way of life. Therefore, 6th graders can practice what they learned about the Google Slides app at the same time that they learn about Spanish culture.

And, Spanish 1 and Spanish 2 students can practice their Spanish skills and know how Spanish high schoolers live.

Treynor FCS Classroom Update Learn the FACSI

The FCS Room has been buzzing this semester with projects of all kinds in Clothing Design, Housing & Interior Design, Health, Early Childhood Education and Child Development Class. These courses and more, taught by Lori Burton, make up one of four Career and Technical Education Programs offered at THS.

Each year the Child Development students get to experience SOME of what it feels like to be pregnant. As a capstone to our prenatal development unit students wear the pregnancy simulators provided by the AEA for one school day while journaling the activities and experiences


