► Technology Expansion & Middle School iPad Initiative...

After a successful year with our high school 1:1 laptop initiative, the district staff has been planning for the expansion of technology in grades K-8. At the February School Board meeting, a plan was approved to purchase 130 iPad computers to be placed in the hands of our elementary students and teachers. In March, each elementary classroom will be equipped with 5 iPad computers. In addition, our middle school teachers will be provided with iPads in order to begin preparing for the rollout of our Middle School iPad Initiative. In August, 180 iPad computers will be issued to students in grades 6-8 for their use during the school day. See Mrs. Bailey's article in this newsletter for more details about this project.

Special points of interest:

- ✓ The school board approved the purchase of 130 iPads!
- ✓ iPads will be for elementary classrooms and middle school teachers.
- ✓ Next school year, middle school students will all be issued iPads.
- ✓ Plans for playground renovations at the elementary continue!
- ✓ Athletic complex construction will begin again around April 1!

► Elementary Playground Renovations...

As I mentioned last month, Mr. Larsen is currently working with staff, students, and our engineering firm to redesign our playground space. We anticipate that this construction will occur during the months of June and July so that the new playground is ready for use by the start of next school year.

► Athletic Complex...

The design and drawing phase of the athletic complex is coming to a close. Construction documents are currently in the hands of contractors and bids will be solicited and opened in early March. By the end of March, we hope to have construction contracts awarded and contractors mobilizing their equipment. If weather permits, construction work will begin at the end of March or beginning of April with construction to be completed by mid-August.

CAUTION: Changes in weather arriving soon...

As the weather begins to change, school cancellations and early dismissals can occur at anytime. If severe weather causes school to be cancelled prior to the start of the day, we will try to have information to the media by 6:30 a.m. In addition to our school website, the media outlets that will carry our announcements this year are: **KMA, WOWT, KMTV and KETV.**



If weather or unforeseen circumstances (loss of power or water) should occur during the day and school is dismissed early, **PLEASE HAVE A PLAN IN PLACE WITH YOUR CHILD.** When early dismissals occur during the day, we usually have limited time to get information out and many parents aren't aware that an early out has taken place. Also, we have over 750 students in the district and only a couple of phone lines in each building. Don't assume that your child will be able to call you if a decision is made to dismiss school during the regular day. Have a plan in place! The elementary has forms for each parent to keep updated outlining your family's specific plan to deal with this type of situation. Parents of middle school and high school students need to discuss with their child what plan of action they will take in the event of an early dismissal during the school day. Proper planning now will provide assurance to you and your child that all will be okay should we ever have an unforeseen early dismissal.

A new Parent Notification system has been purchased to allow Treynor school officials to communicate school cancellations, early dismissals, emergency information, activity schedule changes and general notices or announcements to parents in a timely and efficient manner. Parents have the ability to sign up and select multiple methods for receiving notifications from the school (direct phone calls with recorded voice messages, text messages, emails, text-to-speech, TTY, Facebook, Twitter and RSS). Check the website for updates regarding this new service and sign up on the webpage by clicking on "Quick Links" and then "Notifications".

TREYNOR SCHOOL IS GETTING iPADS



It's exciting to share with you that the School Board approved the purchase of additional technology for our district at their last meeting. The purchase includes 130 iPads which will be distributed to elementary classrooms, middle school teachers and special programs such as Title I Reading/Math, Art and Music. Additionally, iPad covers and new batteries for the 58 laptops that are in two different mobile carts in the middle school will be purchased. Distribution of the iPads should take place in the month of March. Additional wireless access points will also be installed at the elementary and middle school to accommodate the extra devices.

The expanded version of this plan includes iPads for all middle school students next fall. Our Technology School Improvement Committee and Administrative Team will be meeting this spring to plan the logistics of this roll-out.

With the addition of 130 iPads this spring and approximately 180 next fall, a new program is being implemented by Shelly Bailey for students to be trained as technology support specialists. The new program is called **A.C.E. (Apprenticed Computer Experts)**. The plan is to train the ACE Team to help troubleshoot workstation, network and printer problems. Eighteen students attended the initial meeting and the first training session will be held within the first two weeks of March for those that meet the requirements of the program.

Iowa Assessment testing begins on March 11th

In a few short weeks, we will be taking our annual spring testing. Starting on Monday, March 11, our middle school students will be taking the Iowa Assessments. The students will test at the beginning of each day that week. The results have been used several ways, including the following:

- √ Helps the school determine any subject areas or concepts that may need more teaching emphasis.
- √ Scores for schools throughout Iowa are posted on the Department of Education's website and families moving into the area compare school's test scores when deciding which school to enroll their children.
- √ A student's individual scores help determine if he/she is making appropriate academic progress or may need additional academic support.
- √ Taking the tests prepares students to take other standardized tests, including college entrance exams such as the ACT.
- √ Test results help determine if the school has met Annual Yearly Progress goals set by the state.

Please try to make sure that your child is getting plenty of rest and eating a nutritious breakfast before heading off to school each day so they are at their best for testing.

THOUGHTS FROM THE HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL..... MR. NAVARA

Spring fever has hit the student body; unfortunately, it hasn't hit the weather outside. Students are gearing up for scheduling classes for the next school year, spring sports season is underway and the senior class is ready to graduate, which I think hit them at the beginning of the school year. Within the high school, we still have a lot to do, starting with taking the Iowa Assessments. On Monday, March 11 through Friday, March 15, grades 9-11 will be racking their brains to show off their superior knowledge on these tests. The results from the Iowa Assessments will be used in several ways, including:



- Help determine subject areas or concepts that may need more teaching emphasis.
- Help determine if individual academic progress is being made, or if additional support is needed for an individual.
- Help prepare students to take other standardized tests, including college entrance exams, such as the ACT or SAT.
- Help determine if the school has met their Annual Yearly Progress goals set by the state of Iowa.
- Help attract families to Treynor High School. The Iowa Department of Education posts scores from every school on their website, and families moving into the area compare schools' test scores when deciding in which school to enroll their children.

Other items include: CPR training for seniors. All students are required to have taken CPR training before they can graduate, according to state regulations pertaining to the "Healthy Kids Act". Your child will need to pay \$5.00 if they would like to receive a certification card after successfully completing their training. Spring semester parent-teacher conferences and the music trip to Chicago are among the other items.

LUNCH ACCOUNT BALANCES



Just a reminder that students need to maintain a positive balance in their lunch account. Students will not be able to sign out on the last day of school unless their lunch balance is positive. OPEN ENROLLMENT DEADLINE

Parents/guardians considering the use of the open enrollment option to enroll their child/children in another public school district in the state of Iowa should be aware of the following dates:

March 1, 2013: the last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2013-2014 school year, except for "good cause" reasons or kindergarten applications.

Kindergarten applications must be filed on or before September 1 of the school year in which open enrollment is requested. (September 1, 2013 for the 2013-2014 school year).

Mr. Owens' 11th & 12th grade Economics classes participated in the EverFi financial literacy platform and the National Council for Economic Education's Econ Challenge in February. The top three teams in the Econ Challenge are invited to UNI on March 13th to participate in the statewide contest.

3rd and 5th grade students will participate in Treynor Elementary's first annual "Econ Olympics" in May. Each classroom will be assigned a country that they will research to identify key characteristics about that country's economy. Students will participate in different events that test their knowledge and will start to prepare for the event in March after ITBS week.

After the FAFSA is done, now what?

(Reprint from March, 2012 CCC)

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the big item to get done in February for high school seniors to prepare for college. But now the question is what happens from here?

1. The Department of Education will process the application either by paper or electronically. The student will then receive a Student Aid Report (SAR). It can come electronically by email or in paper form. It is a chance to check numbers that were entered to see if any important changes need to be done. The changes can be submitted either on-line or by paper.
2. Some colleges will contact students asking for verification of their FAFSA numbers. Some colleges like the University of Iowa ask for verification for all students. Some randomly select students for verification. Simply follow the directions in the letter instructing you on the verification process and provide the necessary documentation.
3. If something occurs as a major event after the FAFSA is completed which will greatly affect the family income (loss of a job, extended illness, etc.), contact the college financial aid office. They are able to do a professional judgment and possibly adjust the student's financial aid package to be more in line with the family financial situation. The college financial aid office will need some type of documentation to verify the situation.
4. Look for scholarships. Scholarship information is posted on the Scholarship Central web page of the THS web site.
5. All colleges in which the student has been accepted and had FAFSA results sent will respond with a financial aid package to the student in April or May. The package will list the costs of attendance, and then there will be a listing of the financial aid the student is awarded in the form of grants, scholarships, work study, and loans. The college will have a line on the form for the student to accept each line of financial aid. The student then is to sign the letter and send it back to the college financial aid office. Two important points to be made: 1) The student is not required to accept all the financial aid listed on the letter. Obviously grants and scholarships should be accepted. But a student is not required to accept all loans and work study. That part of the package can be rejected, but the student should have a plan as to how they are going to finance that part of the package. 2) Even if a student signs the financial aid letter and sends it in, that does not commit you to that college. If you decide to attend that college, then the signed financial aid package will be binding. Any college that sends a financial aid package that you decide not to attend, you should notify the college that you will not be attending.
6. If the student is taking out student loans, the college will be sending information on the loans including a promissory note to administrate the loan.
7. Make sure to compare your financial aid packages from the various schools that send them to you. You may find that a higher priced college may come through with more financial aid than a lower priced college.

Freshman Orientation for 8th Graders

On March 25, 2013 at 7:00 p.m., Treynor High School will be presenting an orientation meeting for 8th grade students and their parents who will be freshmen for the 2013-14 school year. Topics to be covered will be: graduation requirements, designing a four-year plan of courses, post-secondary education options, NCAA academic requirements for athletes, and scheduling information. This meeting will inform parents and students about the academic course work required to graduate from THS and also to be prepared for college. All current eighth graders and their parents are invited to attend. The meeting will be in the auditorium and will last about one hour.

Seniors: Check Scholarship Central

Go to the THS Website (www.treynorschools.org) and to the counseling page, there is a link that will connect seniors to Scholarship Central. It is the one-stop page for scholarship information at THS. New information is updated weekly. Helpful scholarship links are also provided.

Treynor Local Scholarship Application Deadline: March 15

Seniors applying for local scholarships based in Treynor must have their applications completed and handed in to the counseling office by March 15, 2013.

Iowa Assessments – Week of March 11

During the week of March 11-14, students in the Treynor Community Schools will be involved in achievement testing utilizing the Iowa Assessments. In the past this corresponding testing was called the Iowa Tests of Basic Skills (ITBS) and the Iowa Tests of Educational Development (ITED). The tests have now been reorganized and are called the Iowa Assessments.

The purpose of the testing is to assess the growth of Treynor students in their academic skills. The tests serve as an important resource for teachers to evaluate the abilities of their students and to satisfy state educational requirements toward school improvement and No Child Left Behind on the federal level. Parental support of testing in emphasizing good effort on the part of their students would be much appreciated so that valid results can be obtained. It is also important to eliminate absences as much as possible to reduce the time that has to be devoted to make-up testing. Seniors will have special programming that week and are expected to attend at 8:30 each day.

ACT Test Dates 2011-12

Students may register on-line at www.actstudent.org or pick up a registration packet from Mr. Irvin. Remember the ACT Writing Assessment is optional and students should check with their prospective college to see if the ACT Writing Assessment is required for admission. This applies to the class of 2010 and beyond. Students can also check the ACT Website (www.act.org) for colleges that require the writing assessment for admission.

State of Iowa Grants and Scholarships

FAFSA and the Iowa Financial Aid Application

Although applying for state financial aid requires effort on your part, it has never been easier. By completing the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA\)](#), you will apply for most federal, state, and institutional scholarships, grants, and work study programs. Some state grant programs require a separate application which you can complete through the Eligibility Wizard in I Have a Plan Iowa (www.ihaveaplaniowa.gov). This single application will allow you to apply for multiple state programs. Please be aware of the [individual application deadlines](#) surrounding the state scholarship and grant programs.

Step 1: Complete the [FAFSA](#) after January 1, 2013, for funding in academic year 2013-14. The FAFSA must be filed on or before July 1, 2013, to be considered for most state financial aid programs in Iowa.

Step 2: Complete the Iowa Financial Aid Application after January 1, 2013, for scholarship and grant funding in academic year 2013-14. Apply as soon after January 1 as possible, as the scholarship and grant programs have [priority filing deadlines](#).
