## "District Details" . . a feeu notes from Superintendent Howell

Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL)
The Treynor Board of Education passed a resolution on Monday, February 12, for a special election on April 3, 2018, to ask the Treynor voters to consider a ten-year 67-cent (\$0.67) "voterapproved" Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL) in combination with an income surtax not to exceed ten percent, both determined annually by the Board of Directors.

## Why?



## Special election on April 3 for PPEL!

The Board recognizes their commitment to being fiscally responsible to the constituents of the Treynor Community School District. They also recognize this resource would allow us an additional \$160,000.00 annually to, for example, . . .

Safety: Update security for safety (e.g., lighting, cameras)
Technology: Update technology (e.g., hardware, software, copiers and printers for students/staff)
Transportation: Assure safe vehicles for students/staff (e.g., buses, vans, school cars, large vehicle repair)
Brick and Mortar: Renovate buildings (e.g., air conditioning/ heating units, bleachers, roof replacements, playground equipment, gym floor refinishing)
Equipment: Purchase equipment to maintain facilities (e.g., scrubbers, snow blowers, lawn mowers)
Grounds: Improve the grounds (e.g., constructing sidewalks, paving, fences)
. . . and the list goes on.
Presently, most of these items are paid through the General Fund, which takes dollars away from items that directly impact the students in the classroom. For example, our last two buses were purchased through the General Fund, as well as technology software.

## What?

The Treynor Community School District presently has the regular 33¢ Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL). With the permission of $50 \%+1$ (simple majority) of the voters in the April 3 election, we would be able to extend this another 67\$ per $\$ 1000$ taxable valuation of property. #### Abstract

Shall the Board of Directors of the Treynor Community School District be authorized for a period of ten (10) years to levy a physical and plant and equipment tax of not exceeding sixty-seven cents (\$ 0.67) per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, and be authorized annually, in combination, to levy a physical plant and equipment property tax with the levy of property taxes for collection commencing in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, and to impose a physical plant and equipment income surtax upon each individual income taxpayer resident in the school district on December 31 for each calendar year commencing with the calendar year 2018 or, each year thereafter the percent of income tax not to exceed ten percent (10\%) determined by the Board of Directors each year to be used for the purposes set forth in the full ballot?

## TREYNOR WATCHDOGS

Are you smarter than a 5th grader? Are you a man? Can you contribute 30 minutes to help Treynor Elementary children learn? The WatchDOGS male mentoring program has made it very easy for adults to play educational games in small groups. But, only in half-hour increments. If you have a free morning off, vacation, or retirement time, consider giving 30 minutes to leading games that make math or reading fun. Elementary teachers like small group sessions for students needing extra help with basic skills. They typically do not have the luxury of giving extra time to just a handful of kids. That is where the WatchDOG program comes in. These adults sign up for a 30-minute block of time in advance. The teachers can plan ahead and have fun activities ready for that adult and typically four students. The WatchDOGS get to pick the grade level and time they want.

While the school likes female adult volunteers, they are particularly short of adult men helpers. WatchDOGS help fill that void and shows to students that education is not just a mother-drivem activity.

This is part of the Cardinal Core community volunteer organization. To be a WatchDOG, men must allow a simple background check that Cardinal Core pays. They get a free WatchDOG t-shirt they wear in the school so the students and staff know them. Sign-up for WatchDOG sessions are all in 30 minute slots and are done online well in advance. "If you like children in small doses, and really want to see them catch up with their peers, become a WatchDOG. It truly is fun and games for only 30 minutes."

## Strength and Conditioning

The Treynor High School Strength and Conditioning program is hitting unprecedented levels and starting to see the fall of school records for certain lifts. We just completed our winter max period for all of our athletes; we tested them on bench press, squat, deadlift and power cleans. Each athlete has an individualized program that they are to follow for 8 weeks, after which they max out to establish new baselines for their programs moving forward.

To give you a little context of where our program was at 4 years ago - we had 2 male athletes in the 300 pound squat club, 0 athletes in the 225 pound bench club and 0 athletes in the 200 power clean club; as of this article being written we now have 26 athletes in the 300 pound squat club, 15 athletes in the 225 pounds bench club and 14 athletes in the 200 power clean club.

Our female athletes have seen the same growth as we now have 13 female athletes in the 175 pound squat club, 8 athletes in the 100 pound bench club and 14 athletes in the 90 pound power clean club.

We introduced hex bar deadlifts into our program just two years ago, and Sophomore Ben Boese just broke an 18 year old school record by deadlifting 550 pounds!

We currently offer 7 classes of Strength and Conditioning to our High School students. There are 3 classes of Advanced Strength and 4 classes of Regular Strength. Junior High students are able to come in and lift on Mondays and Fridays from 7-8am. With all of that we regularly have 260+ student athletes come through our doors to get faster and stronger.

As we get ready for spring time and look ahead to summer, we have many new and exciting training opportunities for our kids.
