## SPRING/SUMMER ACTIVITY PASSES

## Adding Fun to Financial Literacy Month



There is growing concern among educators and business leaders that the need for financial education of America's youth is growing. According to the results of the National Financial Educators Council's financial literacy test, administered to students between 15 and 18 years old from January 2012 to February 2014, over 62 percent of test takers received a "D" or an "F" with the average score hitting 59.6 percent.

The lack of understanding about the importance of financial planning doesn't seem to improve much in the adult population. According to a 2014 Consumer Financial Literacy Survey, conducted by the National Foundation for Credit Counseling, 61 percent of U.S. adults do not have a budget and 34 percent indicated their household carries ongoing credit card debt.

## April designated as Financial Literacy Month

To increase public awareness of the importance of financial education in the U.S. and draw attention to the economic consequences associated with the lack of understanding about personal finance, every year since 2004, the U.S. Senate has designated April as Financial Literacy Month. Throughout the month, community initiatives, programs and classes are planned across the country to promote and encourage financial awareness. Plus, nationwide events like Money Smart Week in Chicago (April 18-25) and Teach Children to Save Day (April 24) stress the importance of financial literacy and provide tools to help strengthen money skills. Visit the Financial Literacy Update (occ.gov/flu) to learn more about activities in your home state scheduled for April, as well as throughout the rest of the year.
