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## THS TO HOST MOCK CRASH

On Friday, May 5, 2017, a simulated accident with live students acting as vehicle drivers and passengers will enact a post-collision event. This educational effort is to show the process and potential suffering of a major vehicle collision scene. Treynor students near or at driving age in Middle School and High School will be the target audience (8th through 12th Grade). While serving as an educational tool for students, this event is also a training exercise for the emergency response professionals. Student victims of the crash will be volunteer actors arranged by the Treynor Junior Optimist Club. Real rescue workers, sheriff deputies, Highway Patrol Troopers, and others will follow the all-too-
 routine procedures needed in such horrific situations.

This will be a student activity sanctioned by the school on school time. Students will have time to return to their Card Pride homerooms following the activity to discuss the event.

# NEW IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT FOR 12TH GRADE 

## Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Iowa Department of Public Health has made changes to the Iowa Immunization law for the start of the $2017 / 18$ school year. This change requires that all students entering $12^{\text {th }}$ grade have the Meningococcal vaccine before school starts this fall.

Meningococcal disease is a life threatening illness that is caused by bacteria that infects the brain, blood, and spinal cord. It easily spreads in crowded settings and typically affects older teens and young adults.

All students entering $12^{\text {th }}$ grade must have proof of having the Meningococcal vaccine before school starts in August, unless the student has a Certificate of Immunization Exemption.

There will be no grace/extension period for the implementation of this requirement.
Now is a great time for your child to receive these immunization requirements and beat the back-to-school rush by making an appointment for your incoming $12^{\text {th }}$ grader.

# NEW IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT FOR 7TH GRADE 

## Dear Parent/Guardian,

The Iowa Department of Public Health has made changes to the Iowa Immunization law for the start of the 2017/18 school year. This change requires that all students entering $7^{\text {th }}$ grade have both a Meningococcal vaccine and a Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis/whopping cough) booster before school starts this fall.

The Tdap requirement has been put in place since the 2013/14 school year and requires a booster dose of Tetanus, Diphtheria, and acellular Pertussis containing vaccine for students entering $7^{\text {th }}$ grade, regardless of the interval since the last Tetanus/Diphtheria containing vaccine. Pertussis (whopping cough) is a very contagious disease that causes violent coughing fits that make it hard to breathe.

Meningococcal disease is a life threatening illness that is caused by bacteria that infects the brain, blood, and spinal cord. It easily spreads in crowded settings. The vaccine will be required prior to both the $7^{\text {th }}$ and $12^{\text {th }}$ grades.

All students entering $7^{7 \mathrm{~h}}$ grade must have proof of having both the Meningococcal and the Tdap vaccines before school starts in August, unless the student has a Certificate of Immunization Exemption.

There will be no grace/extension period for the implementation of this requirement.
Now is a great time for your child to receive these immunization requirements and beat the back-to-school rush by making an appointment for your incoming $7^{\mathrm{h}}$ grader.
