## AD HOC COMMITTEES

Whenever the board deems it necessary, the board may appoint a committee of the board composed of citizens, employees or students to assist the board. Committees formed by the board are *ad hoc* committees.

An *ad hoc* committee is formed by board resolution which will outline the duties and purpose of the committee. The committee is advisory in nature and has no duty or responsibility other than that specifically stated in the board resolution. The committee shall automatically dissolve upon the delivery of its final recommendation to the board or upon completion of the duties outlined in the board resolution. The board will receive the report of the committee for consideration. The board retains the authority to make a final decision on the issue. The committee may be subject to the open meetings law.

The board president shall appoint, or the board shall elect, the necessary members to the committee. When possible, and when the necessary expertise required allows, the committee members will be representative of the school district community and shall consider the various viewpoints on the issue. The board may designate a board member and the superintendent to serve on an *ad hoc* committee. The committee will select its own chairperson, unless the board designates otherwise.
