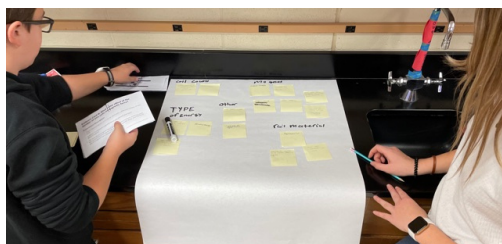

5th-graders in Mrs. Mrsny's class use what they know about matter to guess what is in the bag.

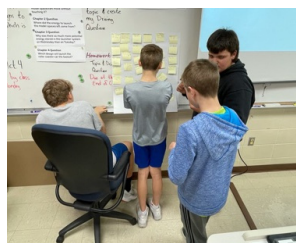
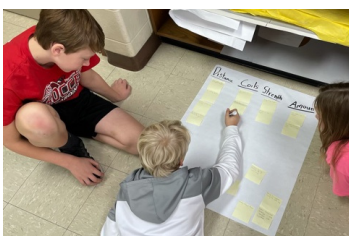

My Hero Marcus Garvey

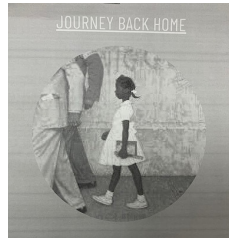

Location:
Near the German town of Strzegom, 40 kilometers to the lower Silesia (Poland)

What it is:
Originally a forced labor camp where 100,000 prisoners worked at a coal quarry owned by the SS.
In January 1942, it was converted for housing medical experiments.
Killing site for Soviet prisoners of war.
Between 1943 and 1945, it was used as a Detentive Labor Camp.

10 facts:
Established 1940
Prisoners were held from 1940 to 1945
Gross-Rosen had 40,000 prisoners
The camp was destroyed in 1945
The SS started working at about 100,000 prisoners working the camp and about 100,000 died between 1940-1945
The first commander in charge August 1940 in February 1945 when it became its own camp
The first commandant of prisoners was
